THE SIGN OF THE CROSS

The Sign of the Cross is drawn with the hand across one's body, while saying the words "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."

This simple gesture that Christians make thousands of times in their lives is not a lucky charm but has a deeper meaning. It is:

A prayer without words, a blessing on oneself A calling to mind the presence of the Trinity A confession of faith and a renewal of baptism A mark of discipleship and defence against the devil A victory over self-indulgence, an acceptance of suffering and an expression of gratitude to God

Can those who are not Catholic use the sign of the cross? Yes. It is used by many denominations and comes from our common Christian heritage. Martin Luther recommended making the sign of the cross at bedtime and first thing in the morning.

When we see professional sportsmen make the sign of the cross - and there is hardly ever a soccer match without several instances of this - there is no need to be critical. Games become special when played with the awareness of the presence of God. All aspects of our lives can be offered to God in this way.

KICK OUT human trafficking!

In South Africa, trafficking in persons takes place across and within the borders of the country. It is a source, destination and transit country as it is seen as the economic powerhouse of Africa. People are trafficked for reasons including for labour and sexual exploitation and it is spurred on by sex tourism. Pope Benedict XVI refers to trafficking as a real 'scourge' of our time and 'Modern Day Slavery'. Primary factors that facilitate trafficking are poverty, family breakdown, gender discrimination, culture, HIV/AIDS, war, natural disasters and political instability, ignorance and demand. Weak laws, corruption and migration contribute.

The main task of the Counter Trafficking in Persons Desk of the Church in South Africa has been awareness raising Contact Sr Melanie O'Connor moconnor@sacbcorg.za

What tourists and visitors need to be aware of:

- South Africa is a 'hotspot' for human trafficking.
- The World Cup is likely to bring about an increase especially of children for cheap labour and sexual services. Most at risk are unattended and lost children as well as street and refugee children.
- Paedophiles can easily disguise their intentions.
- Those who come from desperately poor circumstances may view 2010 as an opportunity to improve their lot.
- Prostitution is illegal in South Africa. Traffickers intermingle trafficked girls among local prostitutes.
